St. Michael's School, in central Tucson, is seeking a Mathematics Teacher to join our talented faculty serving students in the Upper School for the 2021-22 academic year. Upper School at St. Michael's comprises Grades 5-8. Upper School teaching faculty further develop the academic, social, and spiritual foundation of our students. A challenging and enriching experience during the St. Michael's 5th through 8th grade years prepares our students for the challenges and opportunities that await them in high school, college, and beyond.

Qualifications

A qualified candidate should possess a Bachelor's degree in education (advanced study and/or Master's degree is preferred) and at least three years of classroom teaching experience, preferably at the middle-school level. Prior work in a private/independent school setting is desirable. Arizona teaching certification is required. (We will consider others state certifications as well.)

Desired Expertise and Experience

- Competence and familiarity with teaching mathematics including Pre-Algebra and Algebra I
- Flexible demeanor and the ability to handle transitions effectively
- Display and value collegiality with other teachers and administrators; collaborate with the Mathematics team and across all school divisions in a professional manner
- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal
- Strong organization, planning and classroom-management skills
- Love and passion for working with children with ability to teach across different grade levels
- Demonstrated leadership and facilitative skills, including the ability to relate effectively with administrators, operations staff, colleagues, parents, and students
- Demonstrated ability, interest, and experience in integrating technology into a math curriculum

Key Duties and Responsibilities

- Serve as a faculty member for mathematics and work directly with the Division Director to initiate, implement, and oversee the day-to-day mathematics program for students in a particular grade level.
- Provide for students a supportive, orderly, and interactive classroom environment where creative learning takes place through the use of a variety of communication/teaching styles

- Provide academic guidance to students; serve as a student advocate, helping student families respond to specific academic, emotional, and developmental challenges
- Establish an atmosphere of trust, fairness, consistency and respect
- Exercise strong pedagogical knowledge for learners in grades 5-8
- Ability to utilize materials and strategies that are developmentally appropriate and age-specific for each student, regardless of assigned grade level relative to the specific subject matter
- Knowledge and use of student data and assessments to inform instructional planning consistent with curricular goals
- Use both formative and summative assessment practices that lead to clear, timely, and accurate feedback to students and their parents
- Participate in quantifiable professional-development activities and collegial classroom visitation
- Engage in active diversity, equity, and inclusion work that supports the mission of the School
- Serve as an advisor to students; attend school-sponsored events, interact with students outside of the classroom in developing and leading co-curricular activities such as electives, field trips, and other enrichment type programs.

Reporting and Evaluation

All 5-8 faculty report directly to the Upper School (5-8) Division Director, and are evaluated on a timeline determined by the Division Head, in collaboration with the Head of School.

Compensation and Benefits

Salary is highly competitive with area schools, commensurate with years of experience and educational background, and negotiable within established ranges. This is a full-time, academic-year position with benefits that include paid vacation, personal and sick-leave days; plus comprehensive health coverage through Blue Cross Blue Shield; dental coverage; and a matching-contribution program for retirement.
